As things are evolving on an almost hourly basis, we know that any info we give here is subject to change. Therefore, we have tried to ensure this only contains sustainable sources of help. We also know that there is so much more support available than we are able to cover here which is increasing all the time. If we cannot help directly, we will put you in contact with someone who can.

The fantastic efforts of volunteers and local groups are providing the isolated and vulnerable with the help and support they need so that no one is left forgotten and alone. To support the volunteer effort, we have introduced a quick-decision grants scheme totalling £25,000 for local organisations and charities who are carrying out beneficial work in the community. See our website for details. In addition, the Town Council has donated £10,000 to the Felixstowe Relief Charity, which will help those that need it most. See details on the next page. Local authority staff are working tirelessly to collect rubbish, serve the community and carry out essential services needed by us all during this period, and I would like to thank each and every one of them for their continued efforts. What We All Need To Do To Stop The Spread Of Infection

- Stay Home. Protect the NHS. Save Lives.
- Wash your hands with soap and water often do this for at least 20 seconds.
- Use hand sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available.
- Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or sneeze.
- Put used tissues in the bin immediately and wash your hands afterwords
- Keep at least 2 metres (3 steps) away from other people, if you need to go outside.
- Don't touch your eyes, nose or mouth if your hands are not clean.

High-Risk and Higher Risk Groups

All high-risk individuals and higher risk groups have been identified by the NHS nationally and a letter has been distributed that provides details of how to access support with food, medicines etc. if you don't have friends and family who can help you.

If you need help, please contact the Suffolk Freephone Helpline: 0800 876 6926

Please note: This is not a general Coronavirus helpline; it is intended only for those who need help and who can't get that help from family and friends.

The phone call will get triaged and delegated to the local communities officer. The communities officer will then contact the individual to assess their needs and match them with a suitable service. This includes voluntary and statutory position.

The Felixstowe Peninsula communities officer is Chloe Lee.

Pastoral Support

All church buildings are now closed for the foreseeable future. However, faith groups are still functional and anyone requiring help, in the first instance should contact a local church by phone or email.
