Name of Event: Remembrance Sunday

Event Location: War Memorial, Undercliff Road West, Felixstowe

Event Date: Sunday 13 November 2022

Event Times: 10.45am – 11.30am (approx.)

Summary

The Town Council is coordinating the Act of Remembrance in conjunction with the Felixstowe Branch of the Royal British Legion and St. John's Church. Following the Church's Remembrance Service, Civic officials and wreath layers will convene at Felixstowe Town Hall before processing to the War Memorial for the Act of Remembrance.

Managing the Event

Representatives from Felixstowe Town Council, the Felixstowe Branch of the Royal British Legion and St. John's Church jointly coordinate the event and have met regularly in the run up to the event to consider

To support participants, staff and members of the public on the day, an official road closure will be in place, in conjunction with Suffolk Highways, and crowd control barriers will be installed to exclude public from the parade area.

A Risk Assessment has been prepared to consider how to minimise risk wherever practicable and will be reviewed again in advance of the event.

Event Health and Safety

Event Set up and Break down

Site set up will begin on the morning of 12th November 2022 by Breeze Event Productions (PA system) and the Palmer Group (crowd barriers) in accordance with the approved layout plan. The Event Organiser reserves the right to vary the site layout in the event of unforeseen obstructions.

Care will be taken at all times to prevent damage to the ground and preserve the condition of the site.

Once the event has ended, attendees will disperse naturally. Breeze Event Productions will clear the site and reopen the road.

Accessibility

The public areas are wheelchair accessible but to ensure the event is visible to wheelchair users an area is being set aside as marked on the Event Site Plan.

Emergency and Evacuation Procedures

Since the event takes place in an open-air location with multiple points of access and egress, evacuation of the public away from the event in the event of an emergency is straightforward and low risk.

Further first-aid kits and fire extinguishers are located at the Town Hall across the road and will be easily accessible if required.

In an emergency scenario the police and/or ambulance service should be contacted.

Crowd Management

Crowd management issues have been carefully considered and control measures have been taken. A road closure is in place and a safety zone will be established via crowd control barriers and appropriately located Marshals to keep public away from the War Memorial area. The rest of the area will remain open to the public and all usual access and egress routes will be kept clear. Though the event will take place at night visibility on the site is good with street lighting and ambient light throughout the event.

Accident or Injury

If an accident or injury occurs the Event Organiser should be notified immediately and the further safety of the public assessed.

First Aid cover will be provided via the Town Hall. Accidents or injury requiring more than basic First Aid attention will be referred immediately to the emergency services via 999.

Traffic and Parking Arrangements

The site itself is set back from the roadside and a road closure will be in place during the event. The event is in an accessible location with ample public parking in nearby car parks.

Waste Disposal

Bins are readily available onsite. The event is expected to produce minimal litter.

Welfare Arrangements

Public toilets are located in the Town Hall Gardens.

Noise Levels

Noise will be limited to music from the Salvation Army Band and the amplified readings from the service. The event is anticipated to last around an hour and should not be disruptive to local residents due to its location and timing.

Security

Marshals will supervise the road closure.

Supply of Water, Electricity and Gas

Electricity for the PA system is being provided via the Town Hall.
