COMMUNITY INFRASTRUCTURE LEVY ANNUAL REPORT 2016/17

Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) is a charge on new development that is collected by Suffolk Coastal District Council (SCDC) to provide additional funding to help pay for new and improved infrastructure. Money raised can be spent on anything that deals with the demands that development places on the area, such as open spaces, cycle/pedestrian routes and community facilities. CIL is charged on each square metre of additional floor space.

Suffolk Coastal District Council pays Felixstowe Town Council 15% of CIL receipts for developments in its area. The CIL funds must be spent on infrastructure necessary to support development planned in the Council's Local Plan.

The Town Council is required by Regulations to publish a formal report on each year's CIL receipts.
