The Town Council has a continuous programme of engagement with its electorate including; attendance at Town Council meetings where comments are always welcome, surveys, social media, contact us suggestions on our website, at events and Councillors' individual case work.

**Expected growth** – location, size and timing of development sites. What impact would these have on your community needs?

Ferry Road - 200 dwellings

Felixstowe Garden Neighbourhood - 2,000 dwellings incorporating dwellings for older and younger people, affordable housing and self-build plots.

Land at Candlet Road was granted outline planning permission for 560 dwellings

Land North of Walton High Street - 385 dwellings.

Land North of Conway Close & Swallow Close – approximately 150 dwellings

Land at Brackenbury Sports Centre – approx. 80 dwellings

Sunday Market site, Sea Road approx. 40 dwellings

**Projected income** – from all sources including external grants, CIL and s106 income (legal agreements attached to planning permissions).

Felixstowe Town Council will consider priorities with foremost attention to projects that lower the carbon footprint of existing facilities, and which are good for the environment.

The priorities will also support the social, economic and wellbeing of the town.

Investment priorities for the next 3 - 5 years are expected to be as follows:

- New walking/cycling facilities including bike racks (one enquiry received via Student Parliament at Felixstowe School at the Climate Action meeting.
- · Cemetery extension
- Improvements to play areas and open spaces
- Investigations into electric shuttle bus
- Feasibility study to reconfigure The Triangle to make it a multi-functional space
- Improvements to the lighting scheme along the prom/South Seafront
- Allotment improvements
- Develop Cultural and Public Art
