Community Engagement and Update from Chloe Lee, Communities Officer

14 'Community Conversations' informal interviews with the Deputy Mayor have started. We are working closely with Chloe Lee to facilitate these interviews. We are also working with Felixstowe Town Council on Councillor Interviews.

Update from Chloe Lee, Communities Officer

The 'Home But Not Alone' county service was launched at the beginning of the Covid-19 lockdown period, to help connect people who want to volunteer in their communities with neighbours who are most in need.

Chloe Lee (Communities Officer for this area) has been working closely with different charities and organisations throughout this time. In particular Basic Life Charity, and FACTS to deliver essential food supplies, prescriptions etc to residents who are self-isolating or shielding and who have been referred to the Communities team for help. In addition,

The entire district has seen a fantastic community response to the pandemic with groups and action being established quickly to help those most in need. In Felixstowe, Helping Hand's volunteers, led by Town Councillor Darren Aitchison, are a key example of local people going above and beyond to help a neighbour.

The Salvation Army has also provided essential support during this crisis by providing food parcels and hot meals to the most vulnerable. They have also created entertainment packs, delivered toys and outdoor games to families, and run a weekly zoom group for children full of songs, activities and competitions.

Chloe Lee is looking forward to linking back with community groups and organisations, as they prepare for post covid and the 'new normal'.

Hidden Needs Grant programme re-launched.

2018 saw the launch of the former East Suffolk Partnership Hidden Needs Grant programme focussing on older people and families with limited access to resource. A total of £110,000 was available to support projects tackling social isolation, identified by the ground-breaking hidden needs mapping. To date the grant has enabled a range of innovative community projects to tackle social isolation and loneliness in hidden need 'hot spots'. Given the wide reach of the Covid-19 pandemic across the population, the Hidden Needs Grant programme has been re-launched on 08.06.2020. The criteria for applying has now been revised to reflect any/all age groups in East Suffolk experiencing loneliness or isolation (pre covid-19) as we know that these individuals, families and communities are likely to be impacted by Covid-19 to a greater extent than the wider population.

The grant has been topped back up to £100,000, and has been split into two rounds; round one -17^{th} July 2020 and round two - 30^{th} September 2020.

We want to support innovative projects that enable voluntary sector organisations and community groups to tackle social isolation and loneliness and their impacts on our local communities during the recovery from Covid-19. A set of geographical target communities are identified in two new maps, which are available on the East Suffolk Council website on the Hidden Needs Grants pages.
