# Felixstowe – taking the town forward

A draft report on the public engagement event 'Felixstowe – taking the town forward' on 17 July is awaiting approval before being circulated.

126 people attended from a wide and diverse range of public, private, and the community and voluntary sector.

Tim Clarke closed the event with the announcement that Landguard Fort had been invited to host the national launch of the Coastal Revival Fund.

Coastal Communities
Minister Mark Francois gave
his support to over 100 new
local teams that will help
revive England's seaside
towns and decide where
investment goes.

The launch confirmed:

- £1m to fund 104 further Coastal Community teams, on top of the 12 existing pilots (Felixstowe)
- Community Fund £90m Coastal to continue
- £3m Coastal Revival Fund

'by bringing together local businesses, local leaders and volunteers, Coastal Community teams can help tap into their local heritage and make the most of our stunning seaside assets to make a success of the tourist trade' Coastal Communities Minister Mark Francois.

Felixstowe could not have had better national, regional and local promotion and in itself this must bode well for the future of the town.

## **Felixstowe Chamber of Commerce and Industry**

It's been a busy summer for the Chamber team organising meetings and supporting local events.

The Chamber represents its membership via the East Suffolk Business Association Network and was able to welcome other Network members to a meeting held in Felixstowe for the first time. The meeting was well attended. Murray Gibson of Uniserve and Karen Last of Clayden Financial were speakers.

In June the Chamber ran a project funded by the East Suffolk Partnership Capacity Building Fund to engage retail businesses and improve the representation of this sector within the Chamber. Independent retailers in the town centre were surveyed for their views on Chamber membership and town centre development and the outcomes were discussed at a subsequent meeting. We will be preparing an action plan to take the project forward and have already seen an increase in membership.

The outcomes of the survey have also been passed on to the Felixstowe Forward team and have been included in the draft report of the



engagement event held on the  $17^{th}$ .

The Chamber was proud to support the Felixstowe Book Festival which is bringing economic as well as a cultural benefits to the town. The customer survey carried out by Ben Williams showed that many of the visitors to the Festival spent considerable amounts of money in town centre shops and cafes.

BBC Radio Suffolk invited the Chamber Executive

Committee Chair, Rachel Cronin, and Chamber member Richard Ashford from Coe's to an interview in July. The topic was the shared space scheme and both Rachel and Richard highlighted the benefits of the scheme for local businesses and their customers.

## **Update from Suffolk Coastal North**

## Martello Park: Play Area Update

Contractors have been on site since June. Installation of the new and inclusive use play equipment continues to progress well. There has been a minor delay to works due to inclement weather particularly the laying of the wet-pour surfacing to roundabout and multi-play access.

The Project Manager for is working closely with the Sutcliffe Play representative during the installation. A further site inspection is expected in Aug. The RoSPA inspection can then

be scheduled once all the installation is completed.

Park Information signs are being manufactured to complement the improvements, which included the new Public Toilets and Changing Places facility, made across the Park over the past 16 months.

### Promenade Lighting: Planned Works

Regular monitoring has reported that a number of the lighting columns and also decorative lighting support columns have deteriorated and require



replacement. These will be replaced and with new lanterns fitted to the new lighting columns. The replacement works will also necessitate the removal and reattachment of the associated decorative lighting motifs, festoons and their support wire. These works are being planned to get underway in October 2015.

#### **Clifflands: Additional Temporary Public Toilet**

A temporary toilet, for use by the general public, has been added at the Clifflands car park site, from the end of July to early September. This will be locked overnight to help prevent misuse or vandalism.

## **Sports Hub**

Over the past year Suffolk Coastal District Council has been working with key local sports clubs to evaluate the leisure offering in Felixstowe, asking clubs for feedback on what works well, what needs improvement and if they have any barriers to growing their well established teams.

Led by the clubs the Council formed a key working group that is made up of club representatives, Felixstowe Academy and Council officers. This group looks to secure funding to improve the tired on-site facilities and generate space for all clubs to increase participation at the

three main sporting sites; Eastwood Ho, Dellwood Avenue and Coronation Sports Ground.

This project is still in its early stages however it is a great success story for the town and highlights how collaborative working with different sections of the community can achieve common goals and in this case establish a long lasting sustainable sporting offer across Felixstowe.

## **Landguard Partnership**

This month Landguard was honoured to be chosen as the location for the launch of the Government's Coastal Revival Fund by the Communities Minister, the Rt. Hon. Mark Francois MP.

Such recognition highlights the huge potential of Landguard to become a regional visitor attraction with the right investment.

To that end the development of an Heritage Lottery Fund application continue. We have just received the results of a scoping report on the proposed works we are considering.

A successful Saturday was spent at the promoting Landguard, its attractions and events.

Unfortunately one of the Fort's main events also attracted the rain and proved to be a bit of a wash out. It didn't dampen the spirits of those who came including many Royal Marine veterans.

Hopefully the weather will be kinder for forthcoming summer events including a Toy and Model day and Punch and Judy puppet workshops. Planning is progressing for our big Halloween events and a new Christmas event.



The Café continues to be popular: We have added a new interpretation panel to the Visitor Centre which lets people know about the crucial work the Harwich Haven Authority carry out to keep the Orwell estuary (and all the ships, boats and sail craft on it) moving. We have been lucky enough to be assisted in our work with two students carrying out work experience at the Fort, Museum and Nature Reserve. Thanks go to Charlie and Athena for all their efforts.

## **Landguard Nature Reserve**

Port of Felixstowe's CEO Mr Clemence Cheng accepted an invitation for a short tour of the Nature Reserve. He was accompanied by Mr Alan Tinline the Ports Environment and Energy Manager.

The purpose of the invitation was to introduce Mr Cheng to part of the Landguard Partnership that funding from the Port has benefitted from and hopefully generate some genuine empathy for the Nature Reserve.

I was very pleased that Mr Cheng managed to spot a Ringed Plover on its' nest, he also commented on the view across to the Port and reeled off the classification of one ship that was at berth. Mr Tinline outlined some steps that the Port has undertaken to lessen its environmental impact, he also invited me to take a closer look at the Port an offer, I will be sure to take up.

Three flora surveys completed with Hollesley botanist Laurie Forsythe. To date we have not found the elusive Stinking Goosefoot plant this year, although six Sea Holly plants were identified where none have been recorded before.



Five pairs of Ringed Plovers managed four chicks fledged successfully. Six chicks were predated, one infertile egg and four nest failures totalling sixteen eggs which possibly had their eggs predated by Gulls and Crows.
