FELIXSTOWE PROMENADE ORDER 2019

Coming into force: **th ***** 2019

Suffolk County Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended, and of all other enabling powers, and having consulted the Commissioner of Police for the County, hereby make the following Order:-

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as The Felixstowe Promenade Order 2019 and shall come into force on **th **** 2019.

Interpretation

2. (a) The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to an Act of Parliament.
(b) In this Order:-
 - “**the 1984 Act**” means the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;
 - “**the 2016 Regulations**” means the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016 (as amended);
 - “**motor vehicle**” has the same meaning as in the 1984 Act;
 - “**permit**” means a valid ‘C’ permit issued by East Suffolk Council and used in accordance with its terms and conditions;
 - “**Schedule**” means a Schedule to this Order;

General prohibitions

3. Save as provided in Article 5 of this Order no person shall cause any motor vehicle to enter or proceed or stop or remain on Felixstowe Promenade for its whole length.

Contravention of the general prohibitions

4. Where a person contravenes the general prohibition set out in Article 3 of this Order and does not fall into any one of the exemptions in Article 5 of this Order, the registered keeper and driver shall be jointly and severally liable to pay the excess charge and the Council may remove the vehicle.

Exemptions to the general prohibitions

5. Article 5 of this Order does not apply to the following: -
 - (a) a class 2 or class 3 invalid carriage;
 - (b) a bicycle;

- (c) a vehicle where the person in control of the vehicle is in the service of the Council being necessarily used in connection with maintenance, waste collection or cleansing activities in pursuance of statutory powers and duties;
- (d) a vehicle: -
 - (i) being used by the coastguard, fire brigade, ambulance service or police for emergency purposes; or
 - (ii) attending an emergency and being used by a doctor, district nurse or midwife where evidence is provided to show a genuine emergency; or
 - (iii) a vehicle validly displaying a 'C' permit in accordance with the Council's terms and conditions of use.
